In the United States and elsewhere, we celebrate Cinco de Mayo and Mother's Day (8May22). There's nothing particularly mathematical about these two dates, but there are a lot of statistics available. First a little history. Cinco de Mayo is not Independence Day in Mexico. It is celebrated more in the US than in Mexico. Overwhelmed 3 to 1, the Mexicans pushed the French back in 1862. It is now a celebration of Mexican culture, and an estimated 81 tons of avocados are eaten during this holiday.

Celebrated in about 50 countries in different parts of the world, the origins of Mother's Day in the United States began during the Civil War. Now Mother's Day is the third busiest day of the year in the restaurant industry. In 2021, the National Retail Federation estimated that a mind-boggling \$28.1 billion was spent on Mother's Day alone. A whopping 68 percent of moms can expect to get bouquets on May 8.

We are sure that you can come up with more examples of statistics for these two holidays but be sure to enjoy them if they are part of your culture and tradition!
